



## Role Description, Alps 25

Role	District Unit Leadership Team
Role Purpose	The Unit Leadership Teams are responsible for recruiting, preparing and leading the units that will attend the event. The team will consist of a unit Team Leader and a number of additional Unit Team Members. The Leadership teams maybe from one District, or Districts may collaborate to form a joint unit.
Event Objectives	<p>The agreed objectives for the event as set by the County Management Team are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.To deliver an experience that allows young people (14-25) to participate in a range of stretching adventurous activities</li> <li>2. To deliver the event in a way that helps leaders learn how to arrange visits abroad by means of Units for example arranging their own travel, with the 'County' arranging the overall structure and activities</li> <li>3. To deliver a programme that is youth shaped and provides opportunities for young people to complete elements of their Top Awards</li> <li>4. To deliver an event that encourages participation from Scout Network (or 18-25 year olds)</li> <li>5. To develop the capability/experience of our adult leaders in adventurous activities and to leave of legacy of more permit holders</li> <li>6. To specifically encourage the young people to gain experience that would allow them to gain an activity permit where appropriate</li> </ol>

Appointment Requirements	To understand and implement the relevant Scout policies, have a satisfactory DBS clearance and a 'full' adult role in Berkshire Scouting. All mandatory training required for your role must be up to date.
Experience Required	<p>Previous experience of international Scouting and/or adventurous activities is desirable, but not essential.</p> <p>This role is based on the six areas of leadership and management that The Scout Association believes are required to motivate other adults. The role holder should therefore be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Provide direction</li> <li>2. Work with people</li> <li>3. Achieve results</li> <li>4. Enable change</li> <li>5. Use resources</li> <li>6. Time Commitment	Involvement will begin as soon as the appointment has been confirmed and will end following the post event report back. In addition to attending the Expedition, the role will require a significant time commitment through 2024 and 2025
Principle Tasks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recruit unit members. Building on marketing materials and central messages issued by the Alps25 team, ensure that details of the opportunity reach as many young people as possible</li> <li>• Where it helps to do so, bring together unit leaders and young people to form joint units or district units</li> <li>• Arrange transport to and from the Alps25 jamboree site for the unit, including any pre and post event stop overs.</li> <li>• Provide support to the unit members to ensure they gain maximum benefit from the event (including top awards)</li> <li>• Prepare budgets and set the overall price for the trip (The Alps25 fee will exclude and pre and post event costs)</li> <li>• Collect in fees from unit members and make stage payments to the Alps25 team</li> <li>• Follow the visits abroad process and obtain approval for the trip from the relevant Lead Volunteer</li> <li>• Prepare appropriate risk assessments for the pre and post event activities (the Alps25 team will prepare the RAs for the actual event)</li> <li>• Prepare safeguarding and welfare plans for the unit, that meet scout requirements for the pre and post event period.</li> <li>• Attend and contribute to briefings and training events arranged by the Alps25 core team</li> <li>• Ensure that the event is youth shaped</li> <li>• Ensure that Scout rules are followed at all times</li> <li>• Form part of the wider Alps25 delivery team taking on additional tasks as required by the event leader or core team.</li> <li>• Take collective responsibility, along with all other adult volunteers, for the delivery of a successful and safe event.</li> </ul>
